COUNCIL News

The Village Council meets on the second and fourth Thursday of each month at 6:30 p.m. in the Village Hall. Agendas and minutes are posted on the website.

Annexed 149 parcels of land, individually owned, located on Kirk Road, Narcissus Avenue, Gardenia Avenue, Luzon Avenue, Lakewood Road, Laurette Lane, Almar Road, April Avenue and Patio Court; changed the land use for all parcels to "medium density residential" and rezoned all parcels to "residential multi-family".

Authorized an Interlocal Agreement with Palm Beach County for the annexation of 16 enclaves, totaling 34 parcels of land and 12 road rights-of-way.

Approved a final plat for Murphy Oil Gas Station on a .97

acre outparcel at Wal-Mart on 10th Avenue North.

Amended the Code of Ordinances at Section 2-237 "Lien Reductions" to modify the guidelines for the Special Magistrate regarding lien reductions.

Amended and updated the building permit fees for the Village.



Approved a budget amendment acknowledging additional revenues and expenditures for Leisure Services, Special Events, Administration and General Government, increasing the originally adopted General Fund Budget from \$14,055,931 to \$14,114,431.

The Palm Springs police department would like to remind families of the following safety tips for Halloween. October brings spooky ghost stories, costumes, and trick or treating, which can be great fun for children and adults alike. However, we need to use an extra bit of caution on Halloween as we open our doors to people we don't know, leave our homes unattended as we go out, and while driving with all the children walking/running through the neighborhoods in costumes that are sometimes dark and difficult to see at night.

Halloween Safety Tips:

- If a child is young enough to trick or treat, they should have a parent or adult guardian with them at all times.
- Have your child wear reflective tape or clothing, and/or wear a glow necklace, stick or bracelet so they can be seen by vehicles.
- Carry a flashlight so you and or your child can watch their footing when walking in unfamiliar areas of grass or sidewalks as well as again being visible to vehicle traffic.
- If you allow your child to go trick or treating without a parent or guardian, ensure they are with a friend or even a group to ensure their safety. Instruct them not to enter anyone's home or go in an area that is not well lit and/or visible to other walkers.
- Know the route they will be walking and tell them not to stray from that route without letting you know in advance.
- Give your kids a time to be home and make sure everyone is clear on that time so there is no confusion.
- If you're handing out treats, do not open your door to an adult size person(s) if you are alone or reside in a secluded area. Do not invite unknown persons into your home.
- Ask a neighbor to keep an eye on your property if you leave your home unattended.
...and when driving, particularly in neighborhoods, use extra caution due to excited children running across streets and/or wearing clothing that is difficult to see. Drive at a speed that you could make an immediate stop if need be. Subdivision speed limits are 20-25 mph, so by going 10 or 15 mph during the evening hours on Halloween, you could save a life.
