## COUNCIL News

*The Village Council meets on the second and fourth Thursday of each month at 6:30 p.m. in the Village Hall. Agendas and minutes are posted on the website.*

Adopted the Village of Palm Springs Final Ad Valorem Tax Levy for fiscal year 2014-2015 at operating levy of \$3.9000 and debt service obligation levy of \$0.6620 per \$1,000 in assessed value, for a total ad valorem tax levy of \$4.5620. This was a decrease of .0497 from last year.

Adopted a total budget of \$32,046,800 for fiscal year 2014-2015. The total budget summary was posted on the Village's website.

Amended the Code of Ordinance Chapter 14 "Businesses" by modifying Article III "Alcoholic Beverages" to amend the hours of operation of establishments where alcoholic beverages are served (for consumption on site).

Amended the Code of Ordinance at Article IV "Signs" to provide an amortization period for off-premises signs, and amended Section 34-263 "nonconforming signs" to reference landmarked signs and changeable copy signs; referenced new provisions, added Section 34-268 "status of

existing off-premises signs-removal and amortization schedule, routine maintenance", added Section 34-269 "annexation" and Section 34-270 "amortization" to provide new regulations for off-premises signs (also known as billboards and other advertising structures).

Adopted a Moratorium for the filing of applications for installation of Distributed Antenna System Wireless Communication Facilities, and declared a "Zoning in Progress" to complete development of Land Development regulations and right-of-way permitting requirements for the placement and maintenance of above-ground wireless communication facilities.

Approved a Special Exception Use to allow a 1,227 square foot Food 4 Less Convenience Store in the westernmost bay of the Downtown Shops Center at 3729 Lake Worth Road.

Approved a Site Plan and Special Exception Use for renovation and construction of a 2,600 square foot Prescribed Pediatric Extended Care Facility, serving special needs children, to be located in two bays of the



## Trash Pickup Information:

Trash pickup must be placed at or near curbside for collection no earlier than 4:00 p.m. of the day prior to the scheduled collection. Bulk trash shall not be placed in the street or on a sidewalk. Bulk trash may not exceed five cubic yards. All vegetative waste that is small or loose shall be bagged or containerized for collection; this includes grass clippings, leaves, pine needles and similar items. Larger vegetative waste items must be placed neatly in the swale or parkway immediately in front of the premises producing such waste. The amount of vegetative waste placed for collection at any one time shall not exceed approximately ten cubic yards. If vegetative waste exceeds this limit it will be removed by the collector as other waste and subject to applicable rates.

The Village believes your trash should be picked up with satisfaction. In an effort to ensure customer satisfaction, Republic Services employees will tag ‘non serviceable’ items with yellow adhesive tags. These tags will identify the issue or concern along with follow up steps to ensure un-interrupted service. If you have any questions or concerns regarding a tagged item please call Republic Services at 561-478-9590.

Approved the renewal of an Interlocal Agreement with Palm Beach County for the purpose of implementing a new policies and requirements for Cities performing construction work on County Roads.

Approved a Police Department Forfeiture Fund expenditure in the amount of \$8,334.86 to add three interior doors to the existing card access security systems for the records, communications and evidence rooms.

Updated the Schedule of Fees to include new Leisure Services Rental Fees and to delete Code Enforcement Special Magistrate fee on administrative costs.

Approved the purchase of three condensing units and coils for Village Hall, both floors, and the Police Department to replace existing broken and non-performing units, for a total cost of \$140,111.04.

Approved the renewal of the Property/Casualty/Liability/Workers Compensation Insurance with Florida League of Cities (FMIT) for fiscal year 2014-2015, for a total premium of \$542,208.

Issued a proclamation in Remembrance of September 11, 2001.

Issued a proclamation announcing September 20, 2014 as MIA/POW Remembrance Day

Approved a renewal of the Temporary License Agreement with Bayside Pools to provide temporary approval to utilize two 8’x45’ storage containers for business-related materials and equipment (pool pumps, etc.) that cannot be accommodated within their building for a period of 2 years, during which a building expansion can be approved and constructed.
