Council News

The Village Council meets on the second and fourth Thursday of each month at 7:30 p.m. in the Village Hall. Agendas and minutes are posted on the website.

Adopted the Final Non-Ad Valorem Assessment Roll for fiscal year 2012/2013 to provide a uniform method for collection of non ad valorem assessment for garbage, trash and recyclables collection services in the Village. Assessments were set at the same rate as last year...\$144 for single family and \$90 for multi-family and mobile homes.

Accepted seven Easement Deeds from property owners on Barbridge Road for expansion of the utility improvements system.

Approved an expenditure from the Police Department Forfeiture Fund in the amount of \$1,190 for printing of static clings to be provided at no cost to retail businesses throughout the Village for posting on front windows, as part of the department's "Open and Empty" program. These notices would advertise that the establishment's cash register drawer has been left open and void of cash, in order to deter burglaries.

Approved an expenditure from the Police Department Forfeiture Fund in the amount of \$2,310, for the purchase and installation of one digital IP-based indoor fixed camera to be mounted inside the police department's prisoner holding area. The camera would record, in both video and audio, any interactions between officers and prisoners, and monitored by the Village Communication Center.

Issued a Mayor's Proclamation for August 13 – 17, 2012 as Florida Water Professional Appreciation Week in Palm Springs.

The **Leisure Services Board**, advises on matters of recreation, use of playgrounds, athletic fields and recreational centers; the **Construction**

Pumpkin Squares

Recipe type: dessert

Ingredients

- For the crust:
- 1 cup flour
- 1/2 cup oats
- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup softened butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- For the filling:
- 1 can pumpkin
- 1 12ounce can evaporated milk
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 2 large eggs
- 1 1/2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ginger powder



- 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
- Topping:
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 3 tablespoons flour
- 3 tablespoons softened butter
- 1 teaspoon maple extract

Instructions

1. For the crust:
2. Preheat oven to 350
3. Combine the butter, sugar, vanilla and oats in a bowl until crumbly.
4. Press into the bottom of a 9x133 nonstick pan.
5. Bake for 15 minutes.
6. Meanwhile, using a mixer, combine the filling ingredients and mix until smooth.
7. Pour over the crust and bake an additional 20 minutes.
8. While that is baking combine the topping ingredients
9. Sprinkle over pumpkin and bake for 10-15 more minutes.
10. Allow to cook completely before cutting.



Hopefully everybody adjusted well to the start of a new school year. The Palm Springs police department would like to remind families of the following safety tips for the up and coming holiday. The month of October brings spooky ghost stories, costumes, and trick or treating. This can be great fun for children and adults alike. However, we need to use an extra bit of caution on Halloween as we open our doors to persons we don't know, leave our homes unattended as we go out, and while driving with all the children walking/running through the neighborhoods in costumes that are sometimes dark and difficult to see at night.

Halloween Safety Tips:

- If a child is young enough to trick or treat they should have a parent or adult guardian with them at all times.
 - Have your child wear reflective tape or clothing, and/or wear a glow necklace, stick or bracelet so they can be seen by vehicles.
 - Carry a flashlight so you and or your child can watch their footing when walking in unfamiliar areas of grass or sidewalks as well as again being visible to vehicle traffic.
 - If you allow your child to go trick or treating without a parent or guardian, ensure they are with a friend or even a group to ensure their safety. Instruct them to not enter anyone's home or go in an area that is not well lit and or visible to other walkers.
 - Know the route they will be walking and tell them not to stray from that route without letting you know in advance.
 - Give your kids a time to be home and make sure everyone is clear on that time so there is no confusion. • If you're handing out treats, do not open your door to an adult size person(s) if you are alone or reside in a secluded area. Do not invite unknown persons into your home.
 - Ask a neighbor to keep an eye on your property if you leave your home unattended.
- ...and when driving, particularly in neighborhoods, use extra caution due to excited children running across streets and or wearing clothing that is difficult to see. Drive at a speed that you could make an immediate stop if need be. Subdivision speed limits are 20-25 mph, so by going 10 or 15 mph during the evening hours of Halloween, you could save a life.
