

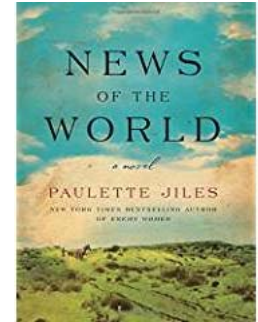


March & April Book Discussion Groups AT THE PALM SPRINGS PUBLIC LIBRARY!

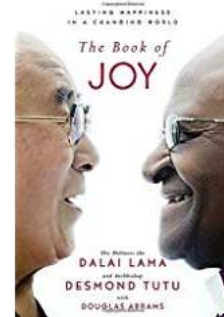

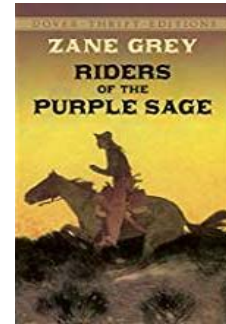


March & April Book Discussion Groups AT THE PALM SPRINGS PUBLIC LIBRARY!

This 1945 satire addresses the socialist/communist philosophy of Stalin in the Soviet Union.

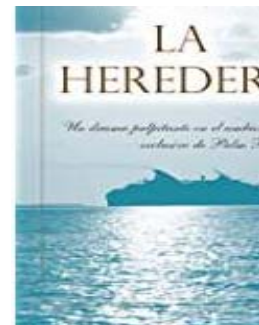
Riders of the Purple Sage by Zane Grey Thursday, April 13th at 3:00 pm

Initially published in 1912 and the first of Zane Grey's many bestsellers, this stirring tale of adventure in the high country established the prototype for western novels of the twentieth century. The plot's focus is a proud young heroine who's determined to defend her Utah ranch. She stands alone against the villains who rustle and stampede her cattle — until a stranger rides into the territory. Notorious as the scourge of Mormon transgressors, the stranger stays on to assist in the inevitable showdown, and romance blooms amid the canyons and cottonwoods.

La Tejedora de Sombras por Jorge Volpi el lunes 13 de marzo a las 6:00 pm

Cuando se encuentran en Nueva York en 1925, Henry Murray es un ambicioso médico de Harvard casado con una rica heredera de Boston; y Christiana Morgan, una tormentosa estudiante de arte, esposa de un veterano de guerra. Atraídos por una fuerza que los sobrepasa, los dos viajan a Suiza para ser analizados por Jung, quien sumerge a Christiana en profundos estados de trance. Las visiones de la joven, fielmente dibujadas en sus cuadernos, se convertirán en el punto de partida de un experimento en busca del amor absoluto que se prolongará durante los siguientes cuarenta y dos años. La tejedora de sombras es el retrato de una mujer que se empeñó en confrontar el universo masculino de su época, y el inquietante recuento de una obsesión llevada hasta el límite.
