VILLAGE OF PALM SPRINGS BEGINS WARNING PERIOD FOR PHOTO-ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM

The Village of Palm Springs red-light safety cameras will begin taking photos of red-light runners at designated intersections beginning January 1, 2010. Photo-enforcement cameras will capture still images and video of red-light running violations. During a 60-day warning period, a warning notice will be issued to the vehicle's registered owner. There will be no fine for this warning notice. At the completion of the warning period, code citations will be issued.

The photo-enforcement cameras will be located at the following intersections:

- 10th Avenue North and South Congress Avenue
- Lake Worth Road and South Congress Avenue
- Forest Hill Boulevard and South Congress Avenue
- Forest Hill Boulevard and Military Trail
- Forest Hill Boulevard and Kirk Road

“The warning period will give residents an opportunity to become familiar with the red-light system. We encourage people to slow down and definitely stop on red before the actual code citations begin,” said Chief Jay Pickens. “This is a public safety program, and our goal is to deter red-light runners and prevent collisions resulting from these violations.”

Cameras will operate 24-hours a day and capture images of every vehicle running a red-light at the intersection. Warning signs alerting drivers to the red-light cameras have been installed prior to the warning period.

The program is administered by American Traffic Solutions, Inc. (ATS) with each violation reviewed and approved by the Palm Springs Police Department prior to being issued.
